PREFACE.

THE year covered by the present volume has been one of deep and varied interest for Churchmen. In the discharge of such a task this magazine may fairly claim the support of all who desire to preserve the Church of England-Catholic, Reformed, and Protestant-as a faithful, zealous, and fruitful branch of the Church of our Lord.
