vich BATURIN, pastor of the church of Evangelical Christians and Baptists in Shakhty and a member of the Council of ECB Churches, was seized—arrested on the long-distance train from Shakhty to Rostov. Having arrested him, the Rostov authorities concealed his whereabouts for five days. For his ministry in the Gospel of God he has already served 13 years in Russia's prisons and in exile; he is now in Rostov prison IZ 59/1, and since 9 October he has been on hunger-strike. He is in bad condition. My repeated petitions and requests for an interview with him to find out whether he is still alive have been categorically refused. I am afraid that he will die as a martyr for his faith in God, like Nikolai Khmara and Vanya Moiseyev. Letters from him, possibly containing instructions in the event of his death, have been seized by the Rostov authorities.

I have lost all hope of receiving justice from the Soviet government for it is with their knowledge that the disgraceful campaign of persecution against believers in our country is carried on.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, on the foundation of Golgotha, and all people of good will who love their neighbour and desire truth and justice, which bring peace to the earth, we beg you:

- 1. to raise your voice to God who is able to send defence and help,
- 2. to petition the government of the USSR and competent international organizations for an end to the Soviet government's persecution of my family and fellow-believers, because of their faith in God,
- 3. to petition for the release of my husband, our breadwinner, from prison.

Your sister Valentina Matveyevna Baturina and the children:

- 1. Vanya-16 years old. 2. Zhenya-14 years old.
- 3. Gosha-13 years old.

- 4. Alyosha–10 years old.
- 5. Vera-8 years old.

6. Lena-5 years old.

I confirm this declaration with my own signature and with photographs of my husband and family.¹

3. A List of Baptists imprisoned in the USSR during 1972

For the first time in five years we are able to print a list of Baptist prisoners. It is the most recent one available and gives the names of those imprisoned last year.

The official reasons for their imprisonment are given in two articles of the RSFSR Penal Code: article 142 and article 227. The first of these concerns the law on the separation of church and state and of schools from the church: a defendant found guilty under this article can be fined 50 roubles or imprisoned for one year for a first offence and for three years for a second offence. The following actions are considered an infringement of this law:

- 1. the distribution of appeals, letters, leaflets or other documents "which call for the non-observance of legislation on religious cults" (e.g. criticism of the 1929 Law on Religious Associations, which many Soviet citizens consider conflicts with the Constitution's guarantee of freedom of conscience and with the 1918 Decree on the separation of church and state)
 - 2. the organizing of financial aid (e.g. for the families of imprisoned believers)

3. "the committing of deceitful acts, aiming at arousing religious superstition amongst the masses of the population" (e.g. any kind of evangelism)

4. "the organization and holding of religious meetings, processions and other ceremonies, which disrupt the social order" (e.g. services held outside, including the baptizing of people in a river)

5. "the organization and systematic teaching of religion to minors" (e.g. the

organization of Sunday schools, services for youth, bible-study groups).

Article 227 reads as follows:

"Organizing or directing a group, the activity of which, carried on under the appearance of preaching religious beliefs and performing religious ceremonies, is connected with causing harm to citizens' health or with any other infringements of the person or rights of citizens, or with inducing citizens to refuse social activity or the performance of civic duties, or with drawing minors into such a group, shall be punished by deprivation of freedom for a term not exceeding five years or by exile for a similar term with or without confiscation of property."

A member of such a group can be imprisoned for three years or exiled for the same period, or, alternatively, imprisoned in a labour camp for one year. But the group's organizer can be sentenced to five years. To baptize a person, or to hold a service in a small room, crowded with believers, can endanger a citizen's health,

according to a Soviet court.

Such are the actions for which the Christians listed below were sentenced.
