## Annotated Bibliography

Bates, William. *The Harmony of the Divine Attributes in the Contrivance and Accomplishment of Man's Redemption*. Harrisonburg, Virginia: Sprinkle Publications, 1985 reprint. A wonderful classic that has been reprinted for modern readers.

Bavinck, Herman. *The Doctrine of God*. Edinburgh: Banner of Truth, 1977 reprint. One of the best treatments of this vital theme. A bit academic but not beyond reach for the growing lay reader.

Berkhof, Louis. *Systematic Theology*. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1939. The portions of this older work which deal with God, His holiness and our Sanctification (holiness) are extremely clear and helpful.

Berkouwer, G. C. *Studies in Dogmatics: The Providence of God*. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1952. Berkouwer is not always a reliable guide, but he is always invigorating for discerning thinkers. This is one of his best volumes, and ministers true soul comfort.

Boice, James M. *Christ's Call to Discipleship*. Chicago: Moody Press, 1986. An excellent popular study.

Bolton, Robert. *General Directions for a Comfortable Walking with God*. Pittsburgh: Soli Deo Gloria, 1991 reprint. Another in the growing number of valuable Puritan reprints.

Bolton, Robert. *A Treatise on Comforting Afflicted Consciences*. Pittsburgh: Soli Deo Gloria, 1991.

Bray, Gerald. *The Doctrine of God*. Downers Grove, Illinois: InterVarsity Press, 1993. A significant modern addition.

Bridges, Jerry. *The Practice of Godliness*. Colorado Springs,

Colorado: NavPress, 1983. A solid addition to Bridges' classic listed below.

\*Bridges, Jerry. *The Pursuit of Holiness*. Colorado Springs, Colorado: NavPress, 1978. Already this little book is a virtual "classic." Used profitably by classes all over the English-speaking world.

Bunyan, John. *The Holy War: The Losing and Taking Again of Mansoul*. Chicago: Moody Press, 1948 reprint. Not as well known as the best-selling *Pilgrim's Progress*, but an important book for personal holiness.

\*Calvin, John. *Institutes of the Christian Religion*, ed. John T. McNeill. Translated by Ford Lewis Battles. Library of Christian Classics, vols. 20 and 21. Philadelphia: Westminster, 1960. Should be owned, read and used by all. Do not be put off by this if you consider yourself an average reader. The portions on God and holiness are always useful.

Charnock, Stephen. *The Existence and Attributes of God*. Minneapolis, Minnesota: Klock & Klock, 1977 reprint. Considered the best by many.

DeHaan, Dan. *The God You Can Know*. Chicago: Moody Press, 1982. A little "gem" now out of print.

Farley, Benjamin Wirt. *The Providence of God*. Grand Rapids: Baker, 1988. The best contemporary overview of providence.

Finlayson, R. A. *The Holiness of God*. Glasgow: Pickering and Inglis, 1955. A more academic treatment that is very useful.

Helm, Paul. *The Providence of God*. Downers Grove, Illinois: InterVarsity Press, 1994. Helm is a philosopher who writes as

a thinker and a pastor.

Helm, Paul. *The Callings: The Gospel in the World*. Edinburgh: Banner of Truth, 1987. Popular in style, useful to undergird a proper view of vocation.

Heppe, Heinrich. *Reformed Dogmatics*. Foreword by Karl Barth, edited by E. Bizer, translated by G. T. Thomson. Grand Rapids: Baker, 1978. One of the best standard systematic volumes.

\*Hughes, R. Kent. *Disciplines of a Godly Man*. Wheaton, Illinois: Crossway, 1991. Get it, read it, use it. Valuable, well-written counsel.

Hulse, Erroll. *Crisis Experiences*. Haywards Heath, Sussex, England: Carey Publications, n.d. In the light of stress placed upon "experience" this is a valuable corrective.

Hulse, Erroll. *The Believer's Experience*. Haywards Heath, Sussex, England: Carey Publications, n.d. A very sound study of proper and holy Christian "experience."

Jeffrey, Peter. *Great God of Wonders: The Attributes of God*. Durham, England: Evangelical Press, 1993. Simple tool for the young or new Christian.

Leith, John H. *An Introduction to the Reformed Tradition: A Way of Being the Christian Community*. Atlanta: John Knox Press, 1977. Leith is always rewarding for the discerning reader.

Macleod, Donald. *Behold Your God*. Fearn, Tain, Ross-shire, Scotland: Christian Focus Publications, 1990. Very solid contemporary treatment that is mindful of the present scene.

Marshall, Walter. *The Gospel Mystery of Sanctification*. London:

Oliphants, 1954 reprint. The classic on this subject!

Neill, Stephen. *Christian Holiness*. London: Lutterworth Press, 1960. Still valuable study that is out of print.

Otto, Rudolph. *The Idea of the Holy*, trans. J. W. Hervey. London: Oxford University Press, 1946. A modern and important work, often quoted.

\*Owen, John. *Temptation and Sin* (Volume 6). Edinburgh: Banner of Truth, reprint 1967. Owen on holiness is the standard Puritan divine. If you read only some of Owen make this part of your reading program.

Packer, James I. *Keep in Step With the Spirit*. Old Tappan, New Jersey: Revell, 1984. Commended with modest reservation due to sympathy for certain charismatic thought that only weakens the stronger clearer portions of the book.

\*Packer, James I. *Knowing God*. Downers Grove, Illinois: InterVarsity Press, 1973. The most significant book of its kind in our lifetime!

Packer, James I. *Rediscovering Holiness*. Ann Arbor, Michigan: Servant Publications, 1992. Very excellent and useful volume.

\*Packer, James I. *A Quest for Godliness*, Wheaton, Illinois: Crossway, 1990. If you wish to understand the Puritans and their love of holiness this is the book.

Packer, James I. *God's Words: Studies of Key Bible Themes*. Grand Rapids: Baker, 1988. The study of Sanctification and holiness is outstanding.

Pink, Arthur W. *Gleanings in the Godhead*. Chicago: Moody

Press, 1975. A study of divine attributes.

Pink, Arthur W. *The Sovereignty of God*. Edinburgh: Banner of Truth, 1930. A little gem that has helped many.

Pink, Arthur W. *The Doctrine of Sanctification*. Swengel, Pennsylvania: Reiner Publications, 1972. Sane and profitable, but the style is often laborious.

\*Piper, John. *The Pleasures of God*. Portland, Oregon: Multnomah, 1992. Gives a proper focus for holiness—God!

\*Piper, John. *Desiring God*. Portland, Oregon: Multnomah, 1986. Will transform your thinking about motivation for holiness.

Plumer, William S. *Jehovah Jireh: A Treatise on Providence*. Harrisonburg, Virginia: Sprinkle Publications, 1993 reprint. Valuable reprint.

Prior, Kenneth. *The Way of Holiness*. Downers Grove, Illinois: InterVarsity Press, 1982. If you can find a copy it is worth the effort.

Ryle, J. C. *Thoughts for Young Men*. Amityville, New York: Calvary Press, 1993 reprint. Useful, though the title may seem to limit its audience.

\*Ryle, J. C. *Holiness: Its Nature, Hindrances, Difficulties and Roots*. Cambridge, England: James Clarke, 1977 reprint. The classic on Christian holiness in my view! Get it, read it, apply it, and carefully measure modern movements by it. (Cf. review this issue.)

Ryle, J. C. *Practical Religion*. Cambridge, England: James Clarke,

1964. A useful addition to the above volume.

Storms, C. Samuel. *The Grandeur of God*. Grand Rapids: Baker, 1984. A very well-written study of God's attributes.

\*Sproul, R. C. *The Holiness of God*. Wheaton, Illinois: Tyndale, 1985. A little "classic" that should be in the top five valuable books on this subject. The video series is also classic.

Sproul, R. C. *One Holy Passion: The Consuming Thirst to Know God*. Nashville: Nelson, 1987. Helpful and clear.

Sproul, R. C. *The Soul's Quest for God*. Wheaton, Illinois: Tyndale House, 1992. Good blend of practice and thought.

Taylor, Jeremy. *The Rules and Exercises of Holy Living*. New York: Harper & Row, abridged edition published 1970. A major book used for centuries. Tends toward a "duty" orientation that can lead to legalism.

\*Tozer, A. W. *The Knowledge of the Holy*. New York: Harper & Row, 1961. Along with Packer the modern "classic" on God and His holiness.

\*Warfield, B. B. *Perfectionism*. Phillipsburg, New Jersey: Presbyterian & Reformed, 1958. An important warning that is not known by most today. He saw clearly where the church was going in terms of bad teaching on Sanctification almost 100 years ago.

\*Wells, Tom. *God Is King*. Durham, England: Evangelical Press, 1992. A wonderful book. (Cf. data in book review.)

\*Whitney, Donald S. *Spiritual Disciplines for the Christian Life*. Colorado Springs, Colorado: NavPress, 1991. A very impor-

tant and balanced study of the Christian disciplines. Along with Hughes (above) this book will shape proper thinking about godliness and growth, without the mystical elements of similar popular books.
